

ADDENDUM
GRACE AND GLORY CHRISTIAN SCHOOL DUAL ENROLLMENT
ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

The purpose of this document is to provide for dual enrollment initial eligibility and course placement through December 31, 2020. This addendum is to be applied to the 2019-2020 and 2020-2021 Articulation Agreements. Except for the provisions outlined in this addendum all criteria of the 2019-2020 and 2020-2021 Articulation agreements remain in effect.

- I. Initial Eligibility Requirements
 - A. State common placement testing requirements are suspended at Chipola College for the summer C term and fall 2020 term.
 - B. Student eligibility requirement for initial enrollment in college credit dual enrollment courses is a 3.0 unweighted high school grade point average.
 - C. Student eligibility requirement for initial enrollment in workforce development clock hour dual enrollment program is a 2.0 unweighted high school grade point average.

- II. Course Placement
 - A. All course prerequisites remain in effect except for common placement test score requirements.
 - B. Chipola College will use alternative assessments for English and college level math courses.
 1. To enroll in ENC 1101, dual enrollment students must have successfully completed high school English I & II and earned 3.0 grade point average or higher in each course.
 2. To enroll in MGF 1106, dual enrollment students must have successfully completed high school Algebra I with a grade point average of 3.0 or higher in the course.
 3. To enroll in MAC 1105, MGF 1107, MAC 1114, MAC 1140 or STA 2021, dual enrollment students must have successfully completed high school Algebra I and Algebra II with a 3.0 grade point average or higher in each course.

The process by which students are notified of the eligibility requirement changes are as follows: Each party will provide a mechanism for communicating eligibility requirement changes to the students. Chipola College will notify school districts and district area high schools. Chipola College will notify students through the college website.

B. Private school students will be responsible for textbook costs.

XIV. Any institutional responsibilities for student transportation, if provided.

A. It is the responsibility of the student to provide his or her own transportation to the College.

XV. Section 1007.271.(25), F.S., requires that the dual enrollment articulation agreement include services and resources that are available to students with disabilities who register for dual enrollment.

A. Students requesting disability accommodations will self-identify with the College Office of Disability Services. Students must provide the required documentation for reasonable accommodations. Chipola College will provide a dedicated academic advisor for students with disabilities to assist with related accommodations.

B. The Private School will cover all costs associated with accommodations for dual enrollment students enrolled in 11 hours or less. The College will cover all costs associated with reasonable accommodations for dual enrollment students enrolled in 12 hours or more.

TERMS of AGREEMENT

This agreement shall be reviewed on an annually. Any changes shall be negotiated and placed in the agreement for the following academic year.


